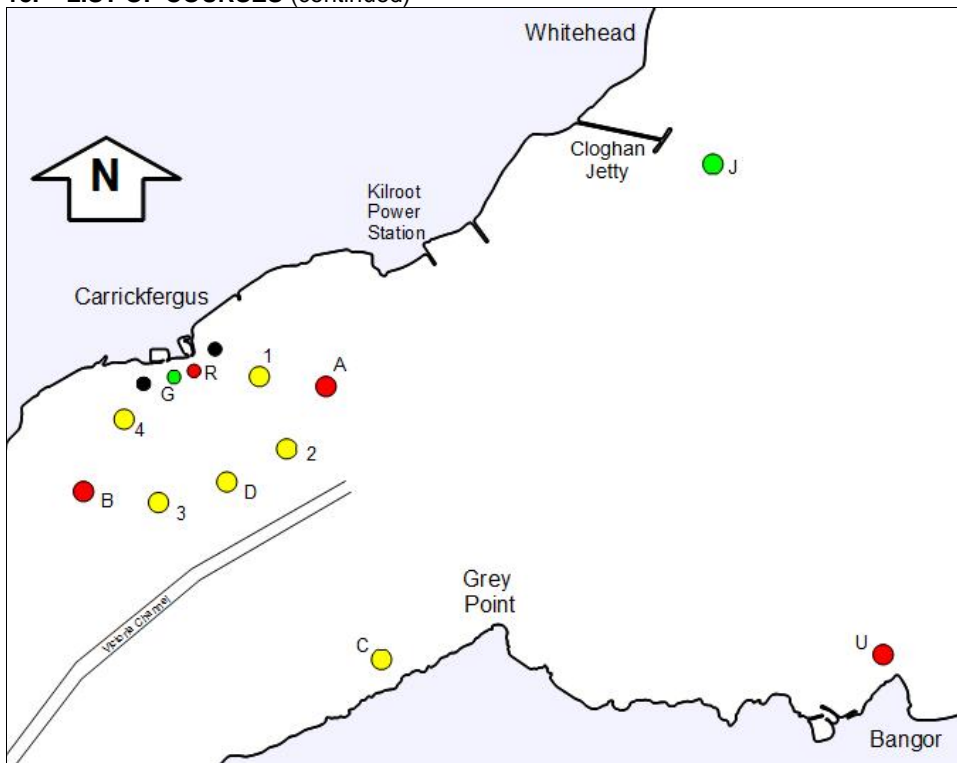


18. LIST OF COURSES (continued)

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

11. STANDARD SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The current BLYC Standard Sailing instructions (SSIs) are downloadable from this website and should be read in conjunction with these SIs. They all apply to this regatta.

12. MORNING DINGHY RACE

There will be an additional race for Toppers and Sailability Dinghies starting at 10:30. Further information and Sailing Instructions will be available ashore before the race as the start/finish line and courses may be different.

13. STARTING / FINISHING LINES

- The start line is formed between the orange pole at the front of the battery and a green limit mark (G) if the first mark is to be rounded to starboard, or a red limit mark (R) if the first mark is to be rounded to port.
- The finish line is formed between the orange pole at the battery and the red limit mark (R) if the previous mark was left to starboard, or the green limit mark (G) if the previous mark was left to port.
- An orange inner limit mark will be laid approximately on the start and finish lines. Boats shall not pass between this inner limit mark and the shore.
- Boats shall not cross the line between mark R and the Orange Pole, or between mark G and the Orange Pole, except on the first leg of the course or when required by RRS 28 "Sailing the Course".

14. COURSES

- Twenty-four courses will be available to be sailed.
- The course for each race will be indicated by a letter on a board above their race number, mounted by the battery.
- On completion of one round of a course, boats should continue on a further round if the course letter is still displayed. If the course letter has been changed, boats must complete a round of the new course. When the letter F is displayed above a race number, that race will finish.
- In amendment of RRS 27.1 the course for any race may be changed with or shortly after the Preparatory Signal for that class.

- G Green Outer Limit Mark of start line

- 4 Round yellow mark N 54:42.15 W 005:49.25
- A Round red mark N 54:42.42 W 005:46.65
- B Round red mark N 54:41.63 W 005:49.70
- C Yellow special purpose conical buoy N 54:40.41 W 004:45.92
- D Round yellow mark N 54:41.72 W 005:47.93
- J Cloghan Jetty Buoy
- U Royal Ulster Red outer limit mark, approx N 54:40.33 W 05:39.50

17. RIGHT OF WAY

Boats shall give way to any ship underway in the Victoria Channel.
